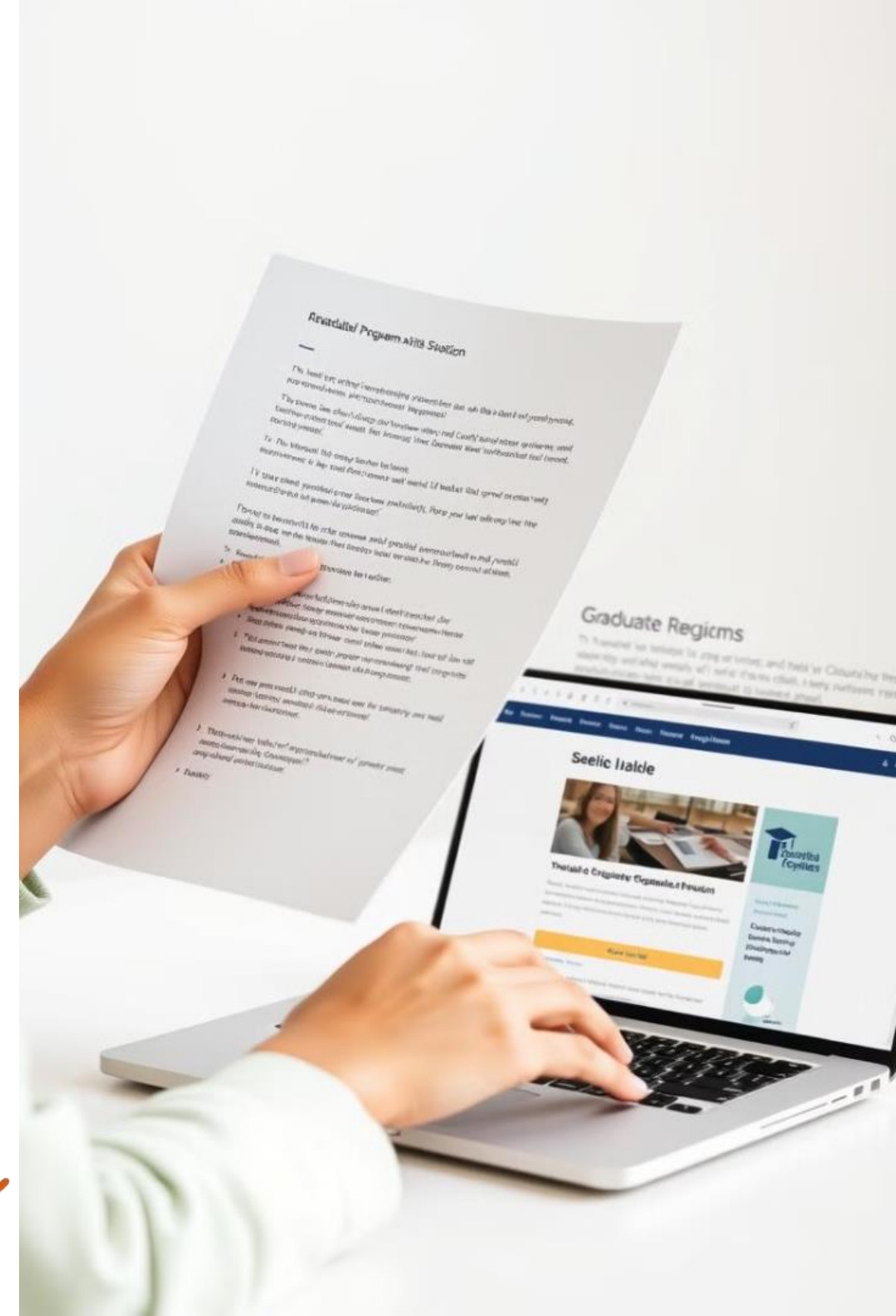
Determine the Required Information
